Your application for admission to Graduate study must be supported by (1) transcripts of your academic record; (2) two letters of recommendation from professors with whom you have studied; (3) MAT applicants should also submit one letter of recommendation from a professional who has observed you working with children or adolescents in a learning environment; (4) the results of the Graduate Record Examinations, as required; (5) a resume; (6) a personal statement that includes a discussion of your past experience and your reasons for wishing to pursue graduate study at Colgate; (7) a \$50 non-refundable application fee (this fee does not apply to former Colgate undergraduates); and (8) a sample of written academic work such as a research paper; (9) certain departments may require additional information or material from applicants. **Application Deadline:** Fall enrollment: February 1. Spring enrollment: October 1.
