Transfer categories

TRANSFER STUDENT

Matriculated in a college-level program or have an associate degree

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT WITH ADVANCED STANDING

Completed college-level classes in a non-degree-seeking program or enrolled in a high school enrichment program associated with a college

VISITING STUDENT

Pursuing one term at Colgate after spending a minimum of one term at home college (requires home college approval)

SPECIAL EXEMPTION

Transfer of one course made for special circumstances

READMISSION

Withdrew or were withdrawn from Colgate

Transfer credits

CLASS STANDING

Individual departments and the Office of the Registrar determine which courses taken elsewhere can transfer for credit at Colgate. At Colgate, one course generally carries one course credit, which is equivalent to four semester hours.

To graduate, students must complete at least half the required courses (16 of 32) at Colgate or on a Colgate study group. Accepted students will receive a credit evaluation with their admission decision.
