# Senior Torchlight Procession and President's Reception

7:45 p.m. Graduates Line Up; 8:30 p.m. Procession
First enacted in 1930 under the guidance of the Alumni
Association of the University, the Senior Torchlight
Procession celebrates the culmination of the graduates'
four years.

To begin the procession, members of the graduating class gather in the Academic Quad for music and an address by the University president. The class members then process down the hill carrying torches as a symbol of the "light of knowledge" they have gained through their education as represented by the torch on the Colgate seal.

Families and other spectators may gather at designated areas (see map on pg. 8–9) to watch the procession before joining the class at the president's reception under the Oak Drive Tent. *For everyone's safety*: We ask spectators not to interrupt the procession and to refrain from tossing objects to the graduates as they process.



# DRIVING AND PARKING ON CAMPUS

#### **COLGATE SHUTTLE**

Parking is limited, so whenever possible, please take advantage of the Colgate Shuttle or walk. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

This free service is open to students and the public for navigating the campus and the Hamilton business district throughout the weekend. Stops include specific event locations on campus and the following sites in the village: Colgate Inn, Colgate Bookstore, Hotel One75, Parry's parking lot, and Eaton Street lot.

#### **PARKING**

On-campus parking over commencement weekend is open to anyone; however, parking is limited and on a first-come, first-served basis. Legal parking spots are marked with white lines. Parking on any roadway is prohibited.

#### **ACCESSIBILITY**

Colgate strives to provide an experience that is accessible to all guests.

#### **Accessible Ceremony Seating**

Graduating students were asked to identify guests who would need to reserve accessible seating tickets for the ceremony, through their Commencement Checklist. The tickets are distributed to the graduates when they pick up their caps and gowns.

For guests who prefer remaining indoors rain or shine, the ceremony will be broadcast into the Class of 1965 Arena (no ticket needed). The facility is wheelchair accessible and will open at 9 a.m. on Sunday.

#### Sign Language Interpreting

ASL interpreters will be signing during the baccalaureate service and commencement ceremony.

#### **Assistive Listening Devices**

Assistive listening devices will be available during the commencement ceremony. Upon arrival, please speak with an usher, who will direct you to the equipment sign-out table. We will ask for a driver's license or other identification at sign-out.

#### **Closed Captioning**

Event livestreams will include closed captioning.

#### Service Animals and Pets

Colgate University welcomes the service animals of our guests. Service animals must remain under the control of their handler and not cause a disruption to the event. Commencement staff may need to relocate a guest's seat if the service animal impacts fire code regulations or cannot reasonably fit within the space provided by the individual's seat. Please note that, per University policy, pets and assistance animals (often known as emotional support or comfort animals) are not allowed in Colgate University buildings or tents.

#### **Accessible Restrooms**

Accessible restrooms will be available at the commencement dinner, president's reception, and commencement ceremony site. Additional facilities can be found on campus, including James C. Colgate Hall and Little Hall. See colgate.edu/campusmap for details.

#### **Parking**

ADA-accessible parking and drop-off locations will be available for individuals with disabilities and those with limited mobility for the commencement dinner, president's reception, and commencement ceremony. Please understand that nondisabled drivers will be asked to move their cars to general parking after dropping off a guest with accessibility needs.

#### **Drop-Off**

For safety reasons, please do not plan for any drop-offs on village streets.

- → Oak Drive Tent events: Drop off at the circle on Oak Drive or the lot behind James C. Colgate Hall
- Commencement ceremony: Drop off in the General Use Lot; golf carts will provide transport to seating

#### **Golf Carts**

Staff members will be driving golf carts on Sunday to help transport guests from accessible parking areas to commencement ceremony seating. Please plan to arrive early to ensure you can be seated before the ceremony starts. If you cannot locate a golf cart or shuttle when needed, please call campus safety at 315-228-7333.

#### DINING OPTIONS

The Friday commencement dinner and the Saturday morning academic reception are free of charge and open to all graduates and their guests. Some specific programs also schedule receptions or dinners on Saturday. Other than that, meals are on your own.

Guests are welcome to purchase meals in Frank Dining Hall. No reservation is necessary.

#### **Off Campus**

There are a variety of dining establishments in the area; be sure to call ahead for hours of operation and space availability. In addition, the local Price Chopper Super Center is a grocery store that also offers graband-go meal solutions.

#### Picnic and Beverage Policy

Graduates may have small private picnics adjacent to their residence halls, University-owned student housing on Broad and College streets, and townhouses.

We ask that gatherings not take place during the following time slots:

- → Friday, 5:30-7:30 p.m. (Commencement Dinner)
- → Saturday, 3:30-4:30 p.m. (Baccalaureate) 8-10:30 p.m. (Torchlight, President's Reception)
- → Sunday, 10:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m. (Ceremony)

Freestanding canopies may be used; stakes and tents are not permitted. Open containers of alcohol are not permitted, except for the picnic location. Kegs are not permitted on University property.
