

“Transgender 101” & Guide to Personal Gender Pronouns



	Cisgender	Genders normalized and affirmed by the binary
	Gender Identity	Inner personal sense of one's gender
	Gender Expression	Ways one communicates one's gender in the social world
	Personal Gender Pronoun	Used to communicate/affirm gender in 3rd person in the social world
	Sexual orientation	Attraction to a gender/sex, all, or none
	Sex	Biological traits commonly used to assign gender at birth
