## Definition

## Sustainability-Related

Courses were selected based on the following definition as outlined by page 38 of the AASHE STARS 2.1 Technical Manual: A course that includes sustainability is primarily focused on a topic other than sustainability, but incorporates a unit or module on sustainability or a sustainability challenge, includes one or more sustainability-focused activities, or integrates sustainability issues throughout the course. To count, these units/modules, activities or issues should be documented in course descriptions or syllabi.

## Sustainability-Focused

Courses were selected based on the following definition as outlined by page 37 of the AASHE STARS 2.1 Technical Manual: Courses in which the primary and explicit focus is on sustainability and/or on understanding or solving one or more major sustainability challenge. This includes: foundational courses in which the primary and explicit focus is on sustainability as an integrated concept having social, economic, and environmental dimensions; courses in which the primary and explicit focus is on the application of sustainability within a field; or, courses in which the primary focus is on providing skills and/or knowledge directly connected to understanding or solving one or more major sustainability challenges.
